<p>Application deadlines for fee-paying programmes</p>	<p><u>Please note we reserve the right to shorten our fee-paying application period should we reach capacity before the application deadline.</u></p> <p>Semester one and full year programme: Application period: 1 February - 1 March 2025</p> <p>Semester two programme: Application period: 1 -30 September 2025</p> <p>Applications are assessed on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications made by fee-paying students to the exchange programme will be disregarded and will not be processed.</p>
<p>Academic requirement</p>	<p>Students need to have undertaken a minimum of 1 year of university level study by the time they start at King's. Students should have a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or above on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent. Please contact studyabroad@kcl.ac.uk in advance if you would like to nominate a student who is under our GPA requirement. We would recommend against nominating students whose major or degree subject is not taught at Kings, as they may not be able to find relevant modules.</p>
<p>Minimum language requirement</p>	<p>If students require a Student Visa, they must meet the specific English Language requirements as specified by UK Visas and Immigration, as detailed on our website: https://www.kcl.ac.uk/abroad/applying/entry-requirements Semester only students can submit a proficiency letter that confirms they meet</p>

Restrictions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Only modules that are listed on the Study Abroad Module Catalogue are available to Study Abroad students (and not all modules at King's College London are open to Study Abroad students!) - Each King's module has a code attached to it, which begins with a number - 4, 5, 6 or 7: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o 4 is a first-year undergraduate module (introductory) - modules at this level are generally open to everyone but some subjects, such as the Sciences and Music require relevant and sufficient background even at introductory level o 5 is a second-year undergraduate module (intermediate) - modules at this level require students to have already taken 3-4+ modules in this subject area at their home institution o 6 is a final year undergraduate module (advanced) - modules at this level require students to have already taken 6-7+ modules in this subject area at their home institution o Modules with codes beginning with 7 are for postgraduate students only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Undergraduate students cannot take level 7 modules o Postgraduate students cannot take undergraduate modules - Students must also ensure that they meet all of the prerequisites listed on the module catalogue in order to be eligible to take intermediate and advanced modules.

Visa Procedures

Visa requirements	Please see: https://www.kcl.ac.uk/abroad/pre-arrival-support/advice-for-offer-holders Full year students must have a Student Visa to study on a full year programme unless they hold a UK or Irish passport. Full year students must not travel to the UK before their Student Visa has been issued. Semester students should check UKVI guidance in case they need to apply for a Visitor Visa in advance (only applicable to certain nationalities).
Visa procedure	Students requiring a Student Visa will receive a CAS via the Admissions portal once they have accepted their unconditional offer. Students should view our Student Visa interactive guide for more information.
Eligibility to work	Only those holding Student Visas or a UK/Irish passport are permitted to work in the UK.
