For example, physical, digital, and multimedia content from communities and groups that have been historically marginalised in society, higher education, and in the Western publishing landscape. Through this endeavour, we seek to create new centres of knowledge.

With your suggestions we can find works that offer global perspectives and address historical under-representations of:

- Disability
- 'Race', caste, ethnicity
- Nationality, cultures and traditions, geographical location
- Gender or gender identity
- Sexual orientation
- Class, socioeconomic status
