Pre-University Summer School (18 and over)

High school students aged 18+ who have a university offer or are in the process of applying can enroll and audit a range of modules in the Undergraduate Summer School, provided they meet the eligibility requirements.

Academic Programme

Pre-University students on this track will **audit one or two undergraduate modules of their choice** and engage in experiential research-based teaching through seminars, workshops, and lectures, alongside international undergraduate students.

Pre-University Students (18+) will attend classes and participate in discussions but will not be required to complete assignments or exams (although they can do so if the assignment is completed independently). Upon meeting the necessary requirements, students will be awarded a King's Certificate of Completion, but not a grade or academic credit.

This track is a great opportunity for students who want to explore a subject at undergraduate level, develop skills beneficial for professional and academic growth, gain insights from King's
